

Small Scale Timber Extraction Demonstration

Managing Woodlands for Income and Biodiversity

The growing demand for wood products provides economic opportunities to manage native woodlands for income and to bring previously under-managed woodland into sustainable management. This half day event will demonstrate a range of practical low impact timber extraction techniques and provide you with an opportunity to meet equipment suppliers practitioners and land management organisations.



The event is aimed at woodland owners and managers and will be held in the Wyre Forest National Nature Reserve with several machinery demonstrations and discussion points. Lunch and refreshments will be provided at Uncllys Farm after the event.



The event will focus on the following aspects:

- Practical low impact machinery demonstration including tractor based forwarding, forwarders, winching and a firewood processor demonstration
- Discussion on maintaining an income from woodlands that can also be managed for biodiversity
- Timber markets and adding value
